The Hungarian Red Cross was established in 1881. During the early years of the World War II, Hungary was aligned with Nazi Germany as part of the Axis powers. As a result, the Hungarian Red Cross, under the leadership of its president Dr Laszlo Kaposzta, faced challenges in maintaining its neutrality and independence. One of the key roles was to provide medical aid to wounded soldiers on the frontlines. The organization established field hospitals and medical stations to treat and care for injured soldiers.
