The Nigerian Red Cross, established in 1960, evolved from British Red Cross activities in colonial Nigeria. It became an independent national society following Nigeria's independence. Recognized by the International Committee of the Red Cross in 1961, it provided humanitarian aid, disaster relief, and wartime assistance, notably during regional conflicts and emergencies.

Around 1963, the Ghana Red Cross Society was actively engaged in humanitarian efforts, following its recognition by the International Committee of the Red Cross in 1960. It focused on disaster relief, first aid training, and health education. The organization played a key role in combating diseases like malaria and supported National Health initiatives. 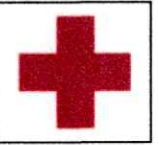

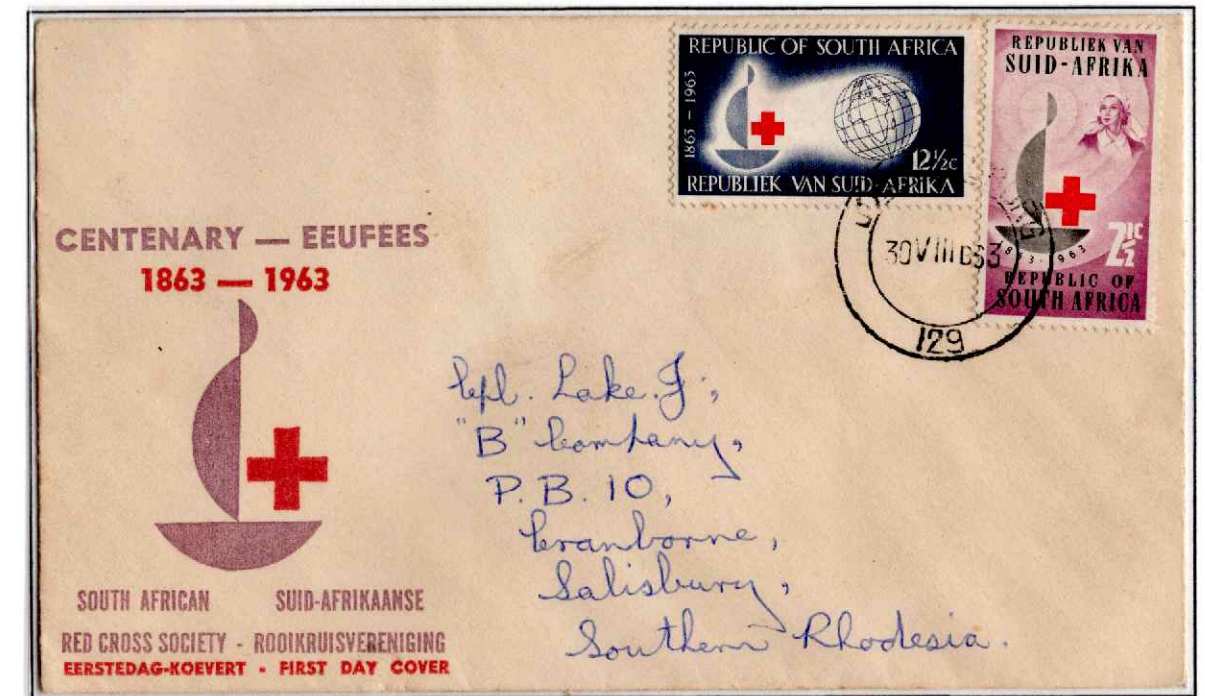

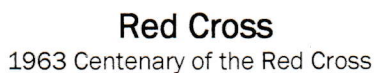


Ship's Figurehead and Emblem

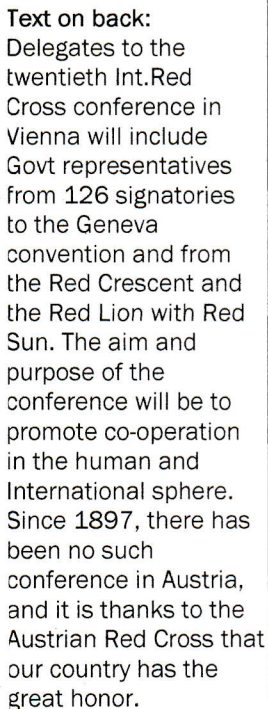


Moynier, Dunant and Dufour

Red Cross

The French Red Cross (*Croix-Rouge Française*), is the National Red Cross Society in France founded in 1864. Recognized as a public utility since 1945, the French Red Cross is one of the 191 national societies of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. It has more than 62,000 volunteers and 17,000 employees. Its network consists of 1,062 local offices, 108 departmental and territorial delegations and 634 social, medico-social and health establishments throughout France, including the overseas departments and territories.

France is the first country to issue Red Cross stamps with a surcharge in 1914. Since then, France has issued 154 such issues in the Metropole and in its overseas territories.

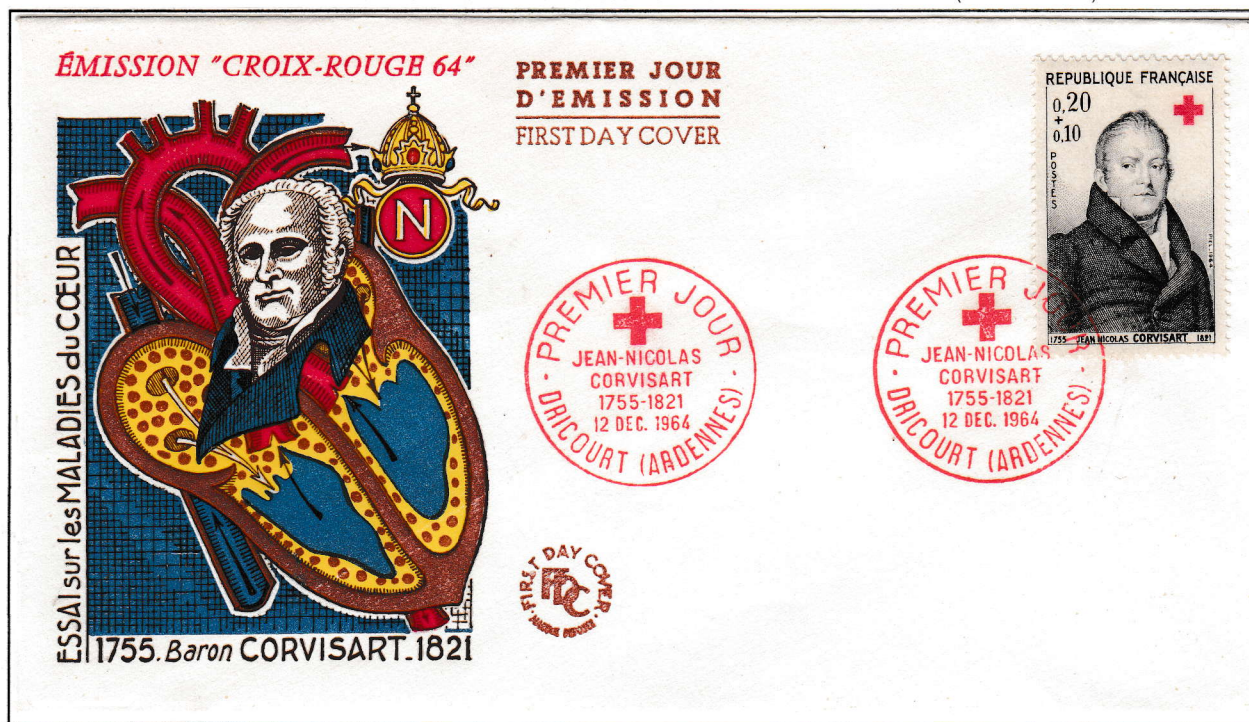

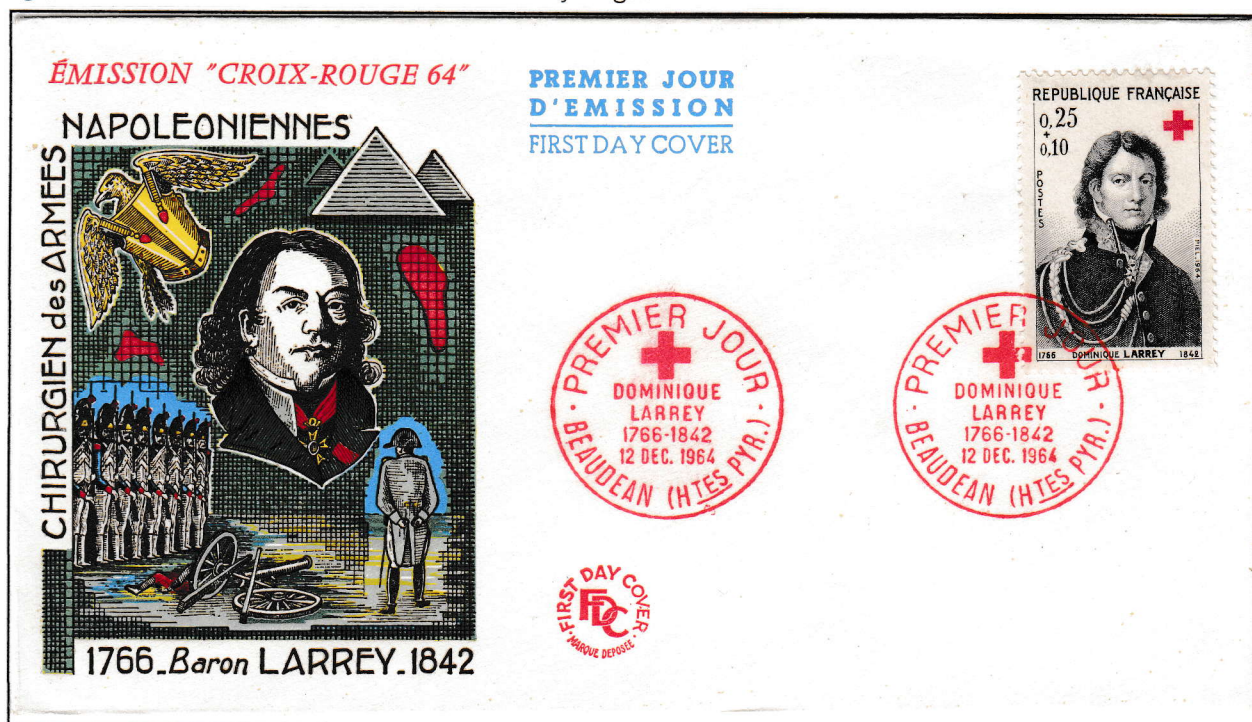
Jean-Nicolas Corvisart-Desmarets (15 Feb 1755 – 18 Sept 1812) was a French Physician who gained reputation as an expert in cardiology. Corvisart resurrected the method of percussion as a diagnostic tool, and began to perfect the technique. He emphasized the study of symptoms and examined postmortem evidence as well. Corvisart became the primary physician of Napoleon Bonaparte since 1804, and would continue to attend to until Bonaparte's exile to St. Helena Island, till October 1815.

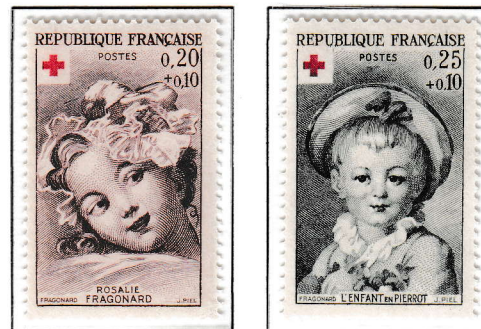

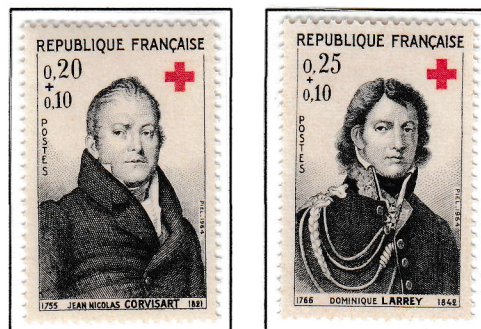

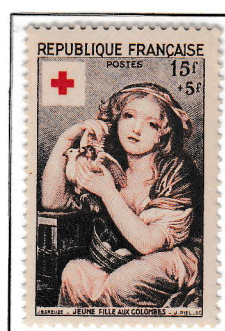

Rene-Nicolas Dufriche, baron Desgenettes (23 May 1762 – 3 Feb 1837) was a French military doctor. He was chief doctor to the French army in Egypt and at Waterloo.

Francois Joseph Victor Broussais (17 Dec 1772 – 17 Nov 1838) was a French physician who believed in the importance of physiology. Broussais theorized bloodletting as cure to every illness and advocated the use of leeches in bloodletting procedure.

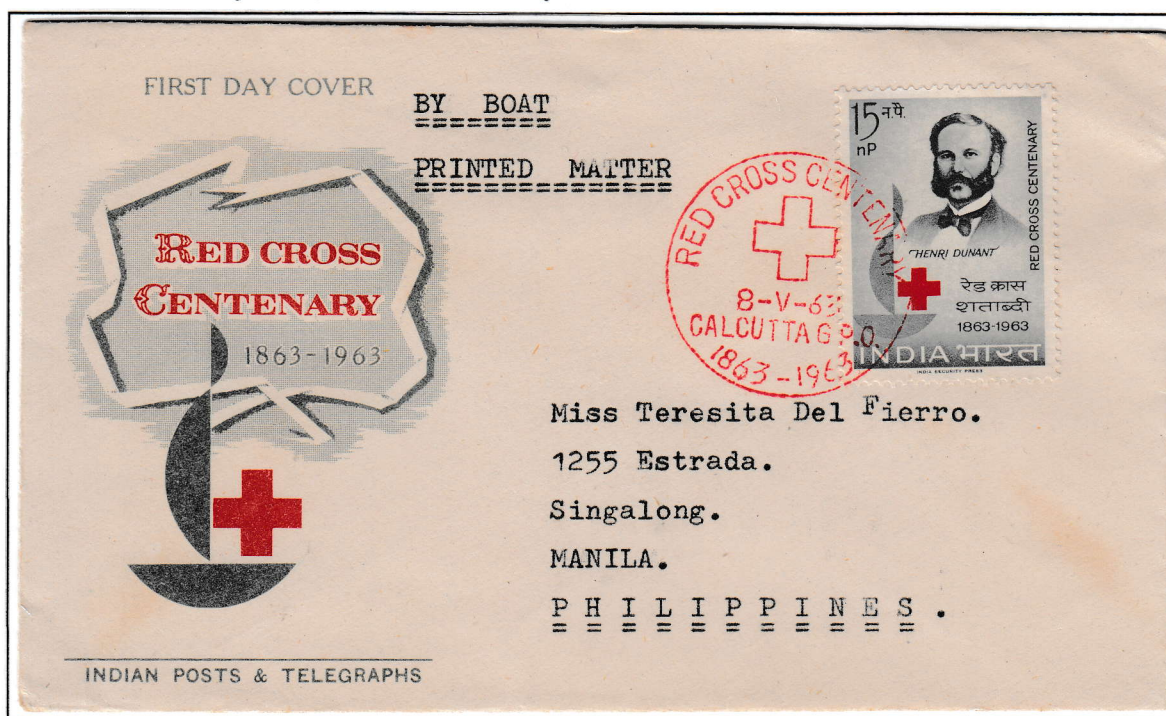

Indian Red Cross: The Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) is a voluntary humanitarian organization to protect human life and health based in India. The society's mission is to provide relief in times of disasters/emergencies and promote health and care of vulnerable people and communities. It has a network of over 700 branches throughout India. The Society uses the Red Cross as an emblem in common with other International Red Cross Societies. Volunteering has been at the very heart of the Indian Red Cross Society since its inception in 1920, with the Society having Youth and Junior volunteering programmes. The Society is closely associated with St. John Ambulance India.

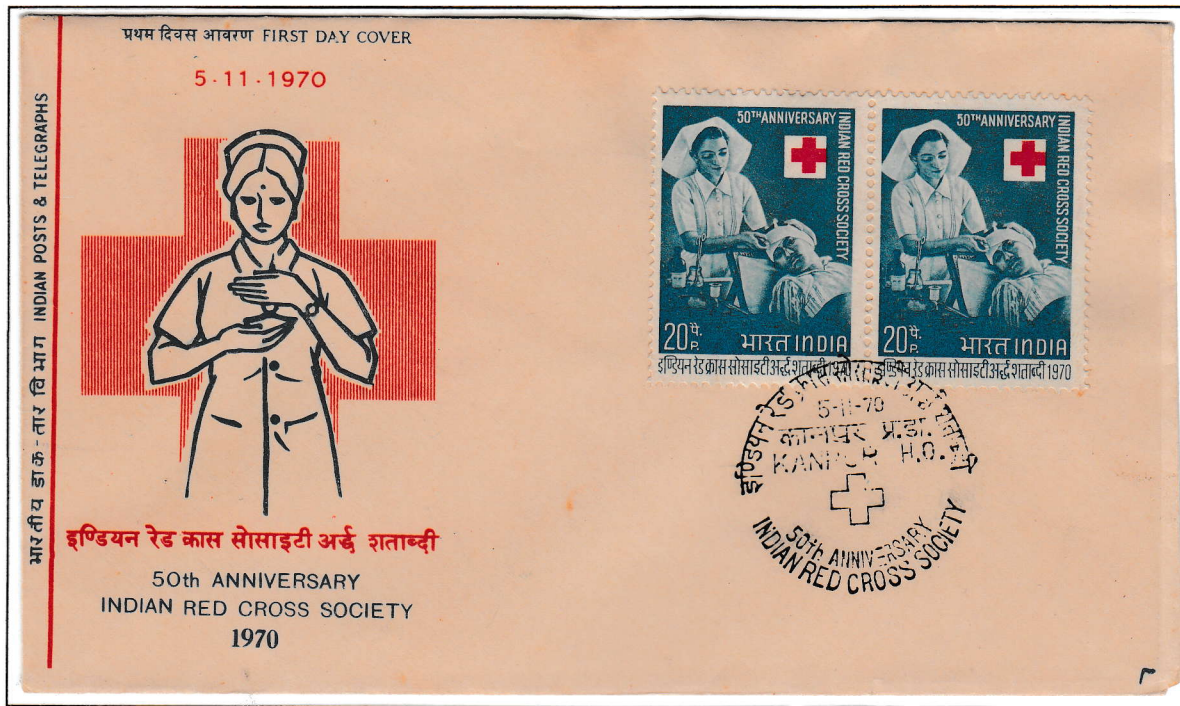

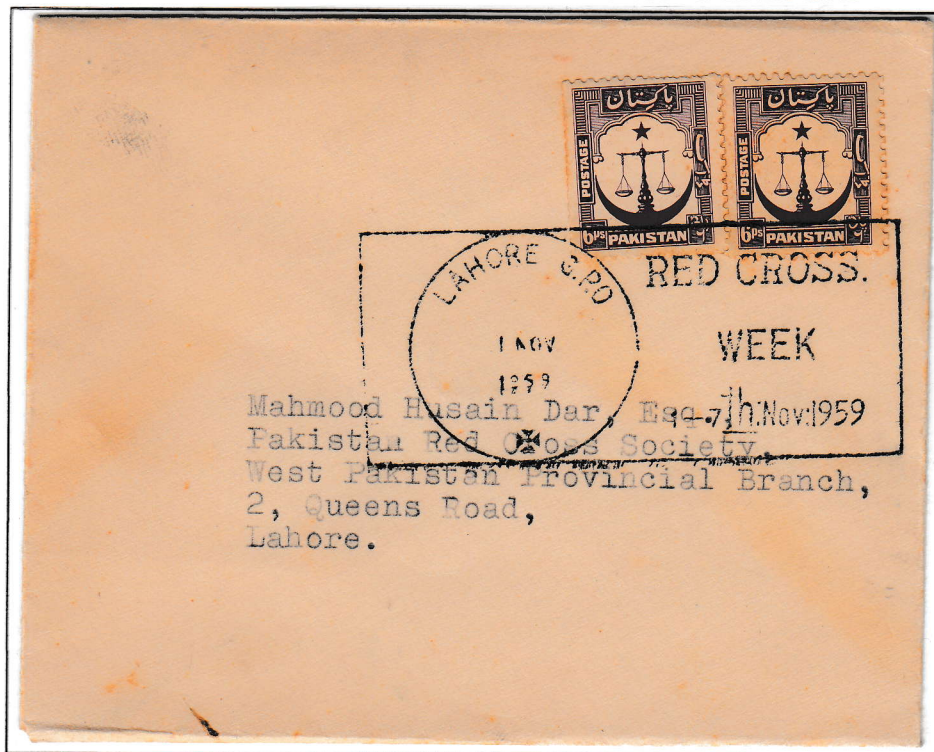

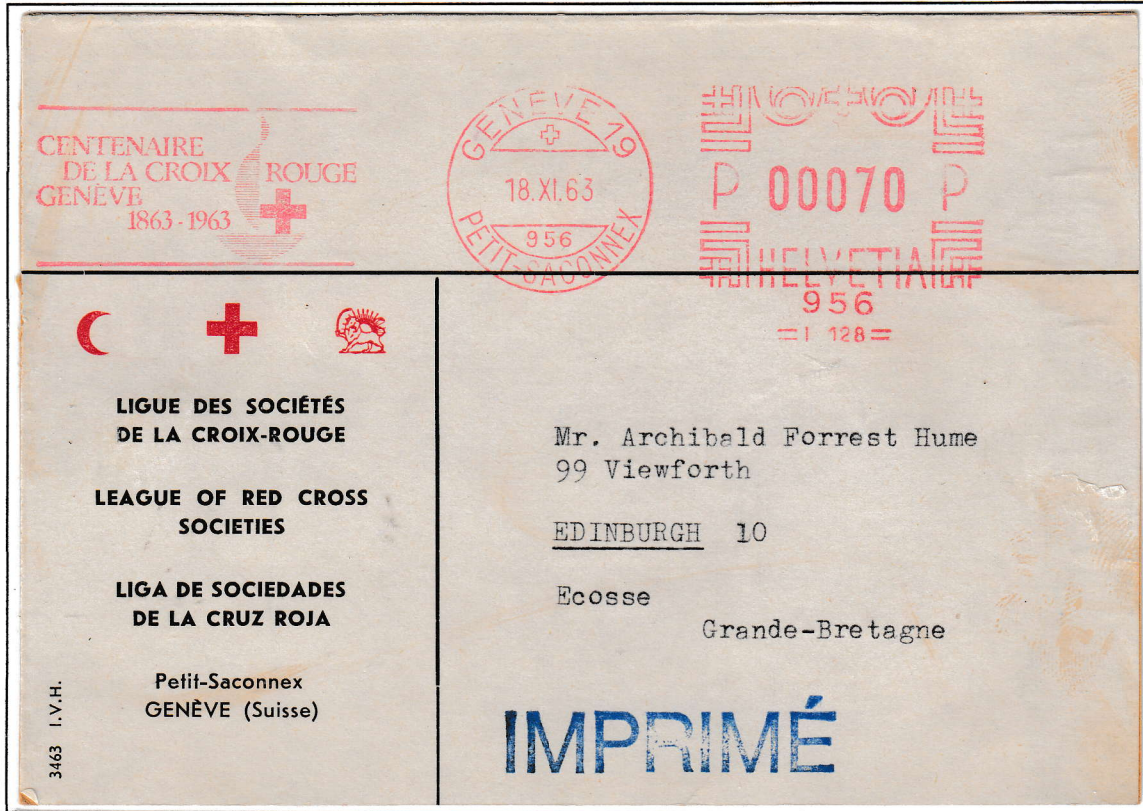

Swiss Red Cross: The Swiss Red Cross (SRC) is Switzerland's oldest and largest relief agency, made up of 24 cantonal leagues, five rescue organizations, three foundations and two societies. The SRC was established on 17 July 1866 at the instigation of Federal Councilor Jakob Dubs and the Red Cross members Gustave Moynier and Guillaume-Henri Dufour. After its foundation, the SRC named itself as an "aid organization for Swiss soldiers and their families"
