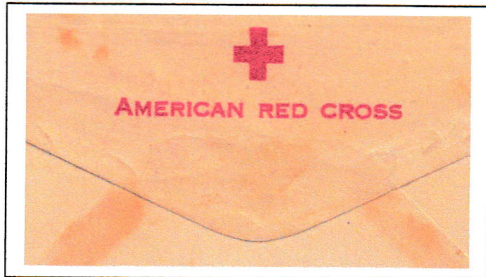
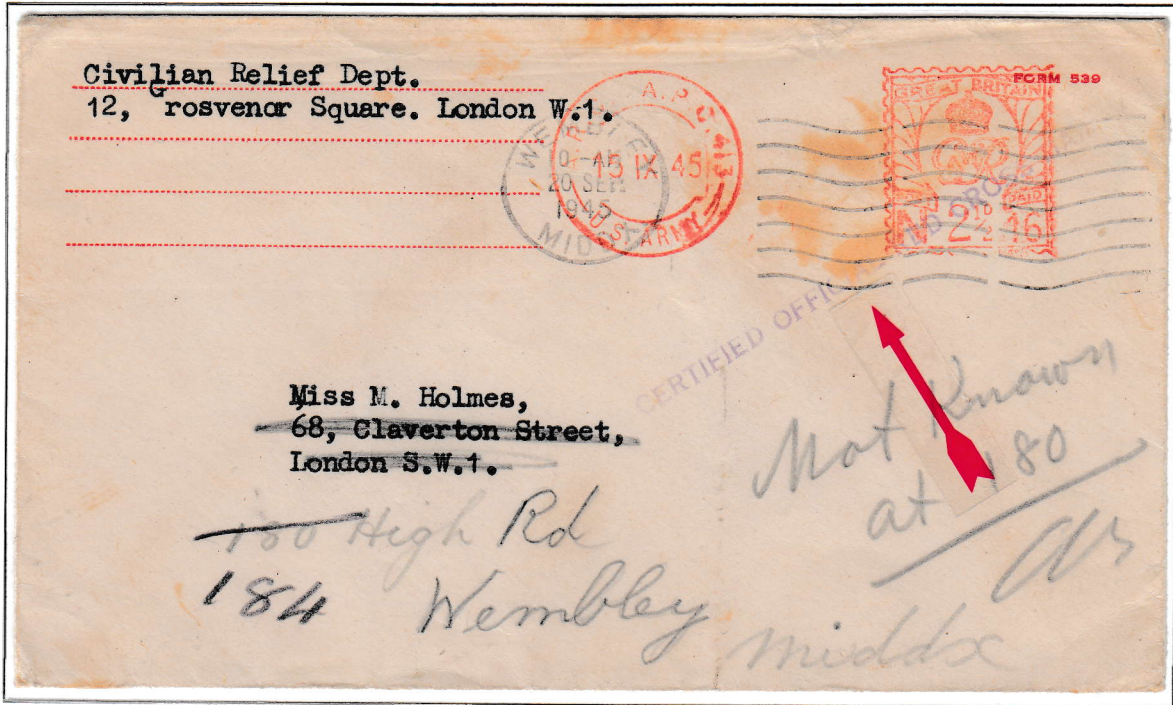


Red Cross

British Red Cross: The British Red Cross Society is the United Kingdom body of the worldwide neutral and impartial humanitarian network of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. The society was formed in 1870 and is a registered charity with more than 17200 volunteers and 3400 staff. At the heart of their work is providing help to people in crisis, both in the U.K and overseas. The Red Cross is committed to helping people without discrimination, regardless of their ethnic origin, nationality, political beliefs or religion. Queen Elizabeth II was the patron of the society until her death on 8 September 2022.
