SAAR

A German territory South-east of Luxembourg. Occupied by France under League of Nations control from 1920 to 1935. Following a plebiscite, Saar returned to Germany in 1935 from when German stamps were used until the French occupation in 1945 German-Saar stamps were used, The territory was autonomous under French protection until it again returned to Germany at the end of 1956 following a national referendum. Issues from 1957 were authorized by the German Federal Republic pending the adoption of German currency on 6 July 1959, after which West German stamps were used.
